Moinul Hoque Choudhury, Ex-Union Minister, Govt. of India who was the pioneer of the modern education in Barak Valley. The college was later shifted to Algapur, Hailakandi in the land which was donated by the founder Janab Sohidul Alom Choudhury in the year 2000.

The College popularly known as M. H. C. M. Science College, Algapur, with its academic zeal, aims at providing quality education to rural students while augmenting their meaningful participation in both curricular and extra-curricular activities. The College started in the year 1997 with traditional science subjects, i.e. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics, economics, Botany and Zoology. To provide wider opportunities to students of multiple disciplines it gradually started new subjects including professional courses like Computer Science, Computer Application, Anthropology, Biotechnology and Mass Communication. Although, it is a science college, now students of Arts and Commerce background have the

opportunity to study subjects like Computer Application, Economics, Mass Communication and Anthropology.

Moinul Hoque Choudhury Memorial Science College is a coeducational institution imparting science education among the boys and girls. At present the total enrolment is 618 where boys are 427 and girls are 191 in number. The male-female ratio thus stands at 1: 0.45

#### PRESENT SCENARIO IN TERMS OF QUALITY:

The College is purely a science college and thus multidisciplinary education is not available in the college. Morover, there is no provision for students to perform research work. However, most of the teaching staffs have publication in reputed National and International Journals including Scopus and SCI index journals. Most of the faculties have participated and completed various faculty induction programmes and Refreshers courses. They have also participated and organized various seminars, workshops and training programmes.

#### PRESENT SCENARIO IN TERMS OF FUTURE PERSPECTIVE:

Technology wills impact education in multiple ways. Our college has computers, projectors, smart board, and various education related software used for easy transformation of education. The internship facility of the students is likely to be started from next year. Many of the faculties of the college are doing research works in collaboration with institutes located in India and abroad viz. Iran Silk Research Center, Agricultural Research, Education and Extension Organization (AREEO), Gilan, Iran; King Khalid University, Saudi Arabia. The research experience of the faculties is an added advantage to adopt NEP 2020 which aims to start research exposure to students at degree level.

CCTV cameras is being used to monitor the teaching-learning transactions.

Parents would be given feedback on the progress of their wards from time to time and parents would be involved in decision-making in regard to initiatives to be undertaken to benefit the students.

# 4.2. STRATEGIES TO MITIGATE THE CHALLENGES- LONG TERM AND SHORT TERM

The quality of teaching and learning process will be much better if Government of Assam, Higher Education Department provincialise the eligible staffs for better and effective implementation of NEP 2020.

College will best utilize the development fund for infrastructure development. However, as a newly provincialised college, Government of Assam may be requested to provide financial grants for classroom, laboratory and library development.

The college has faculties in the department of Computer Science and Computer Application who have expertise in the field of Information technology can mitigate the challenge of integration of technology subject to the availability of financial grants. Moreover, college plans to recruit technical staff.

The college will seek necessary approvals to introduce vocational courses.

The college will apply to Assam University, Silchar for allotment of examination centre and providing permanent affiliation. On obtaining permanent affiliation, the college will apply to UGC for 12B recognition.

Internal quality assessment cell (IQAC) has been empowered to supervise development activities in the college and to conduct quality assessment on various parameters laid down in National Assessment Frameworks. IQAC is also entrusted to

design a blueprint for future development of the college in consultation with other NAAC accredited institutions.

# 4.3. STRATEGIES TO PROMOTE LEADERSHIP AMONG FACULTY MEMBERS AND STUDENTS

It is very important to develop leadership skills amongst the faculty and students in a college. The college can offer classes directly related to leadership skills, management, and public speaking. These classes can help sharpen leadership abilities.

#### iii. Participation in extracurricular activities:

Extracurricular activities can also help to develop and improve leadership roles on campus. By holding the position of president or secretary or another position in an organization or committee in the college or by becoming the captain of a sports team, or an in-charge or event coordinator in a programme organized by the college one can learn organize, communicate, coordinate, and cooperate in order to effectively complete the assigned duty. This will definitely give the opportunity to interact with other members and develop strong leadership.

#### iv. Participation in Group Projects:
